Y3 have made some pneumatic toys this week - that's where you use air as a component in a mechanism to make something move. We worked hard designing our toys and following our design using a clean burger box to make it come true.















Here are 3 finished examples. You can see they vary in complication based on each child's design. Some of us made animals, like Tamara's lovely lion, and some people made 3 eyed monsters like Clayton and Jackson! Inside the burger box is a balloon and a tube. When you blow into the tube, the balloon inflates, and it opens the creature's mouth!



Year 5 have been creating Christmas Toys this term in DT. They have used their previous skills (such as a running stitch to add applique and cross stitch to apply buttons), in combination with their new skills of perfecting a blanket stitch. They've done an amazing job - well done!




The main purpose of the PTA is to raise funds for extra items for the children such as football kit, ukuleles and gardening equipment.

Holy Angels After school Club



If you require an After school club place for your child in Holy Angels Pre-school, it is important that you book 24 hours in advance. After School club has a maximum number of children it can accept and there are occasions when it has been full and places are not available. Also, for your child's safety, it is important that Pre-school know to expect your child.

Further to the above, <u>please let the school know if you have booked your child into</u>
<u>After School club at Holy Angels Pre-school.</u> Again, for their safety we need to know where the children are going at the end of each day.





School Meals

All meals must be ordered by midnight the day before via ParentPay.

Please note that parents whose children are entitled to Free school meals or universal infant free school meals must also order their children's lunches in advance.



Nut free school!



Please be reminded that the school is a nut free zone.

Please check your child's packed lunch before sending it in. Children are not permitted to eat products containing nuts on the premises.

Nuts and peanuts can cause allergic reactions, which are sometimes severe, resulting in anaphylaxis. This can be life-threatening.

We insist on the school being a nut free zone to protect the children in our school who have this life threatening allergy.
