They saw how the position of the sun changes our shadows, learning that in the morning and evening our shadows are long, and in the afternoon they are shorter. It was good fun drawing around our shadows!


Year 4 enjoyed a messy investigation of the digestive system! Mashing the food to represent chewing and pushing it through tights to represent the small and large intestines!!!







In Year 6 we have been learning about micro-organisms. We learnt that yeast is a good micro-organism that helps bread to rise. We mixed some yeast with sugar and water and placed it in bottles. One bottle had cold water, one warm and one boiling. We put a balloon on top of each and watched what happened. The balloon on top of the warm water was filled with carbon dioxide as the yeast reacted with the sugar and warm water.





Year 6 led some thoughtful prayers for the whole school linked to the Stations of the Cross.

The children were reminded of the sacrifice that Jesus made in the events leading up to and including Good Friday.

We will celebrate Easter on our return to school on Tuesday 22 April.
