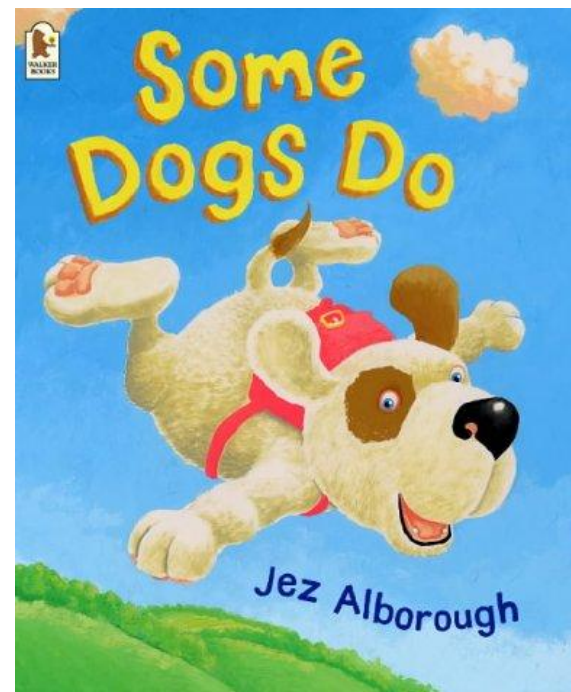




# Some Dogs Do

| Key Vocabulary | Definition                                       |
|----------------|--|
| swirling       | Moving in a twisting or spiraling pattern        |
| twirled        | Spin quickly and lightly around over again       |
| daft           | To be silly or foolish                           |
| yelped         | To squeal or screech (like a dog)                |
| howled         | To cry out loudly                                |
| lonely         | To feel alone or without friends                 |
| raised         | Elevated to a higher position; raised up/ lifted |

| Question Marks | <p>Indicates a question:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Did you see me fly just then?</li> <li>Do dogs fly? Is it true?</li> </ul> |
