

The main aim of the project is to raise attainment in reading and writing across the school. More information about the project can be found at http://www.primarywritingproject.org.uk. I am pleased to report that since we began the project in September 2017 at the end of the Spring Term we have seen a significant increase in the number of children working at age related expectations and at the higher level (Greater Depth) in Reading and Writing. Our predictions for attainment at the end of KS2 this summer also demonstrate a significant improvement compared to the last two years and I look forward to sharing this information with you when it is published in July.

Unfortunately on Monday we will be saying goodbye again; this time to Kate MacFadyen and Sarah Baker.
