Reception Class have been enjoying the beautiful weather this week in our outside area. After listening to the story of Farmer Duck we acted out the story to each other using our puppet theatre. We have also been practising our cutting skills by chopping up vegetables in the Mud Kitchen to add to our recipes.

This week as part of our Science unit Animals Including Humans Year 1 went on a minibeast hunt at forest school. We found lots of different minibeasts such as spiders, snails, worms and woodlice. We noticed that lots of the minibeasts we found were tucked away under logs and rocks. We found lots of snails hiding in a plant pot in the dark and damp. We talked about the similarities and differences between the minibeasts that we found and used our magnifying glasses to observe them closely. We made sure that we were quiet and respectful so that we didn't disturb the insects in their habitats.

On Wednesday, KS1 welcomed Laura from 'We Need Music' for a special music workshop. Laura taught us some new songs and some new musical games. She also played a variety of musical instruments for us to listen to. She played a harp which was calm and relaxing, she also played us some songs on the guitar which we enjoyed dancing to. We listened to the lovely sound of the kalimba and discovered a new instrument called a shrutibox, an instrument from India which produces long lasting sounds by gently pushing the sides. This reminded us of the ocean and we sang a song as we listened to the music and pretended we were on a boat. Most excitingly, Laura let us all have a go at playing each of these instruments. We strummed the harp, guitar and ukulele, used our thumbs to play the kalimba and gently pushed the shrutibox to make those long lasting sounds. It was such a lovely opportunity to explore and discover these instruments. We had such a fun time with Laura!
