Since our Trust safeguarding review in April we have to ensure that every event that is held in school is fully risk assessed. This means that where children are being left without parents we need to ensure that our adult/child ratios are adequate and any medical needs are identified and able to be met.

This means that we are no longer able to sell tickets on the door of events. We do apologise to anyone that was disappointed, but parents will need to purchase tickets to all future events in advance (where children attend without their parents and outside the school day) to ensure that we can meet our safeguarding obligations.

Holy Angels After school Club



If you require an After school club place for your child in Holy Angels Pre-school, it is important that you book them in prior to your child arriving at the pre-school door. After School club has a maximum number of children it can accept and there are occasions when it has been full and places are not available. Also, for your child's safety, it is important that Pre-school know to expect your child.
